

Basic Overview:

Running Backtrack Blitz Night:


Using the Blamee powerpoint game (which can be downloaded from our website in the same place that you downloaded these instructions and flyer) you will compete in a boys vs girls review game to see which gender has the best memory. If powerpoint is not available, please see the last pages of this file for an alternate way of competing. Questions can be asked in one of two ways:

- 1. You can alternate by asking question 1 to the girls, question 2 to the boys, questions 3 to the girls, etc. If the girls miss their question, the boys can have a chance to answer and vice versa. If both teams miss the question then read the page number included with each question and see who can find it first.
- 2. You can just have a general mob mentality and ask questions to everyone and see who stands up to answer first.

After they answer the question, the child will pick a blue square on your powerpoint game board. Clicking on that square with your mouse will reveal a point value behind the square, which is how many points that team gets. A "Blamee" will reset the teams score to zero. Bonus Questions are given at the end for the kids to answer especially if it is a close competition. For these questions simply call on the child who stands up the fastest.

At the end of the question time, we recommend giving a small prize (i.e. piece of candy etc.) to each player on the winning team.



If PowerPoint is not available at your church, you can also print out papers and tape them to the wall in a fashion similar to what is seen below. Print out copies of the following pages and use masking tape to tape the papers to the front wall of your classroom. It may be best to do three rows of 7 (21 total) or 3 rows of 8 (24 total). Each question that the kids get right gives them the chance to come up and pull one paper off of the wall. They will get the points or lose all their points if they pick a "blamee."
